

Our mission has expanded through the years where we now offer our services to disabled persons from all walks of life and have implemented a youth program.

2014 was an unusually busy year for the officers, board members, and other volunteers at Outdoor Buddies. I hope you enjoy looking through this annual report and are reminded of some of the Outdoor Buddies activities that happened during the year.

As Outdoor Buddies grew, so did our mission to improve the lives of more individuals and we are blessed to be able to provide more outdoor adventure opportunities for more very deserving people. However, this growth puts more demands on our volunteers. To that end, we expanded the number of our Board members to fifteen during 2014 and may expand our board of directors again in 2015. OUR MISSION

Outdoor Buddies' mission is to provide opportunities, through a volunteer organization, for those who have been deprived of enjoying outdoor experiences. The focus is on those who are mobility-disabled, at-risk youth, and youth groups. Outdoor experiences include:

- Hunting
- Fishing
- Boating
- Camping
- Education in the use of the outdoors for recreational activities

The opportunities are available to all, with no cost (other than personal expenses) with no discrimination due to race, color, creed, religion, sex, or family status. We endorse the principle that wildlife and the environment are to be protected, preserved, and managed for the benefit of all people.



OUR HISTORY

Outdoor Buddies was co-founded in 1984 by Sid Sellers and Sam Andrews. Sam was Director of Therapeutic Recreation at Craig Hospital and Sid was a long-time volunteer Hunter Education Instructor for the Colorado Division of Wildlife and an avid outdoorsman.

The organization was created because it was recognized how important it was to supply therapeutic recreational opportunities to rehabilitating patients who had suffered spinal cord injuries.

Through the years, Outdoor Buddies has expanded its programs to assist all mobility-disabled persons. The organization has also instituted a youth program aimed at providing outdoor educational and recreational opportunities for at-risk youth and other youth groups.

Outdoor Buddies, Inc. was registered in 1988 as a Nonprofit Corporation under the laws of Colorado and has continually complied with all applicable requirements of the office of the Colorado Secretary of State.

The Internal Revenue Service has recognized Outdoor Buddies as a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization. Contributions to Outdoor Buddies are tax-deductible to the extent allowed by law.

Sid Sellers served as Outdoor Buddies President and Executive Director from its inception until declining health caused him to resign as President in July 2004. At that time the board of directors selected Dwaine Robey to succeed Sid as President. Sid continued as Executive Director until his death on August 5, 2006.

Sam Andrews retired from Craig Hospital in 2008 after thirty-four years of meritorious service.

Dwaine Robey served as President from 2004 until 2012 when Larry Sanford was voted in as President. Dwaine continues to work diligently as Outdoor Buddies' Executive Director.

2014 • THE YEAR IN REVIEW

In 2014, Outdoor Buddies celebrated our 30th year in operation. We had our most successful Annual Banquet ever at the Wildlife Experience, which was attended by a record crowd.

The year's programs included ice fishing at Tarryall Reservoir, antelope, deer, elk, turkey, dove, pheasant, and waterfowl hunts for our mobility-disabled hunters, women, and youth. In addition, we hosted campouts for youth groups at our Tarryall camp.

With cash and in-kind donations, the improvements at the bunkhouse are complete and the facility is now available for use for hunting or fishing outings in the area.



Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Coors and their Out of the Box Foundation gave us a generous grant which made it possible for Outdoor Buddies to purchase two Action Track chairs. We were also honored to receive another Action Track from Janet Holm, who donated it to us after her husband, Roger passed away. In addition, in the past few years, some of the equipment purchases we have been able to make include a Bad Boy UTV and a Haulmark Trailer. All of this equipment makes it easier to give our mobility-impaired members the chance to enjoy the outdoor activities that they wish to pursue.

Plans are being developed for an even greater year in 2015. We will be pursuing additional grants from foundations that are willing to support our mission.

The following sections of this report give more details regarding some of the 2014 activities.



90% of donations were dedicated to our mission. Only 10% went toward administrative costs.



HUNTING OUTINGS

Outdoor Buddies carries out a wide variety of hunting outings for mobility-disabled hunters and youth hunters each year. Hunting outings are organized and conducted for antelope (or pronghorn), coyotes, deer, doves, elk, turkeys, upland birds, and waterfowl. These hunting outings are typically done on a one-on-one basis; meaning that there is one hunter and one able-bodied helper/guide.

For these outings, Outdoor Buddies provides a location for the hunts and an able-bodied helper/guide at no cost to participants. Participants in these outings are required to pay their own personal expenses, including hunting license fees.

Outdoor Buddies hunting activities are normally carried out on private land where access is obtained through agreements between landowners/land managers and Outdoor Buddies representatives.

Big game hunts, including antelope, deer, and elk, have been conducted for approximately one hundred thirty (130) each year for the past few years. Additionally in 2014, we conducted about thirty (30) youth hunts, primarily for antelope.



Big game hunts are held each year in several locations within Colorado including Custer, Douglas, Larimer, Moffat, Montezuma, Park, and Routt Counties.

During the 2014 big game hunting seasons hunters experienced nearly an 80% successful harvest ratio while participating in these outdoor adventure experiences. The annual fall pronghorn hunt at Meadow Springs Ranch is typically one the most exciting hunts for Outdoor Buddies hunters each year.

A City of Fort Collins ordinance approved in 1993 authorized a revocable permit agreement with Outdoor Buddies, Inc. granting to Outdoor Buddies the right to use the Meadow Springs Ranch property as part of its Disabled Hunters Program for pronghorn antelope hunting.

Outdoor Buddies recognized this agreement as both a fantastic opportunity as well as a great responsibility to conduct activities on this property in a safe manner and work with Colorado Parks and Wildlife personnel conduct hunting activities to effectively manage the pronghorn population on the ranch. We also recognize the agreement as a privilege and thank the City of Fort Collins for granting the use of this property to Outdoor Buddies.





FISHING EVENTS

During the past few years Outdoor Buddies has hosted several fishing events. Thanks to the generosity of Dan Forsyth, we were allowed, for three years, to fish on his private land on the Arkansas River near Coaldale. In 2011, Outdoor Buddies took several veterans from Healing Waters and provided them lunch in addition to an absolutely beautiful spring day of fishing. The next two years' fishing events on the Arkansas were organized by Terry Nelson and attended by Levi and Mike Trujillo, Todd Bacon, Dwaine Robey, Dylan and Sherri Harrell, their two children, Avery and Ivy, Larry Sanford and his wife, Penny, Jim and Tim Smith, Kathy Shears and of course Dan Forsythe and his Great Dane Sadie.

With the help of Colorado Parks and Wildlife and Joe Arcese, we have had several fishing outings on the Cache la Poudre River. The CPW has stocked the river at Steven's Gulch with many, many nice size trout, so the fishing (flies, lures and worms) has always been great for everyone. Some of the fishermen and women who have attended in the past are Al and Gerry Montoya, Joe Arcese and his helper Joe DeSantis, George and Jarunee Carter, Terry and Jeff Nelson, and of course, Wally Hunt who acts as chief cook and bottle washer. Due to the wildfire in Poudre Canyon followed by the terrible flooding, we weren't able to have the annual event in 2014, but hopefully will be able to enjoy another trip in 2015.



Terry Nelson arranged an ice fishing event at Tarryall Reservoir in January of 2014. The fishermen were Dylan Harrell and his son Avery, Aaron Smith and his son, Cooper and of course, Terry. The guys enjoyed some decent fishing and a beautiful winter day on the ice and then headed to the Outdoor Buddies Bunkhouse for some chili and conversation with visitor Wally Hunt.

The event this year (2015) was co-hosted by Terry Nelson and Dylan Harrell and was held on two days, January 24th and 25th. Terry headed up early in the day on Friday to get things set up and start getting the bunkhouse warm. Gerald Robinson hauled the snow machine from Denver so that it would be available if needed and, in addition cleaned the wood stove and brought wood.

As the day progressed, people started arriving and by the end of the day there were quite a number of people in attendance. In addition to Terry, Gerald, and Dylan, there was Dylan's son, Avery, Aaron Smith and his son, Cooper, and Chris McGuire, all of whom bunked in the Outdoor Buddies cabin. The Hockaday family, Rick, Elaina, Paige, and Mike, brought up their trailer in which to stay. The Brown party included Bruce and Lori who stayed over in Fairplay and Paul who had a real "outdoor" experience by sleeping in a tent at the lake (with no heater).



ANNUAL BANQUET

On Saturday, April 5th, 2014, as we have done for the past several years, Outdoor Buddies held its annual fundraiser banquet at the Wildlife Experience in south Denver. Again this year we had a record number of attendees, making this the most successful banquet ever.

Outdoor Buddies Executive Director, Dwaine Robey kicked off the evening's program with a welcome and thank you for the great support given to Outdoor Buddies.

After introductions and brief statements from the officers, Dustin Robey, Vice President, introduced Dan Daru as Master of Ceremonies. Dan, a local Denver TV personality and week day reporter on Fox 31's Good Day Colorado, has served as our Master of Ceremonies for the past 3 years.

Again this year, the Young Marines Color Guard presented the National Colors and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by youngsters Taylor and Trevor Robey and Romeo and Bella Daru. Todd Bacon delivered the invocation.

The keynote speaker was Major-General, Joe Arbuckle. He spoke about the impact of budget cuts on the Department of Defense and wounded warrior status in reference to the military drawdown in Iraq and Afghanistan.



Larry Sanford, Outdoor Buddies President gave a presentation demonstrating how adaptive equipment is used to assist disabled persons in their pursuit of outdoor activities.

Dan Sweir, representative of the NRA presented a grant check from that organization to Outdoor Buddies President, Larry Sanford. Kathy Sweir, as she has done for the past several years, spent the entire evening taking pictures of the event

Auctioneers John Anderson and Jeff Sweeney began the live auction and, with the assistance of Dan Daru, Dustin Robey and Amy and Chris Darow kept the action going. Marcie Gregg recorded the live auction sales and Ann Robey and Darlene Seeley kept busy handling all the financial data.

The “Buy it Now” feature for the silent auction was a huge hit thus setting the stage for making this an annual addition to the banquet auctions. The evening concluded with the raffle prize drawings with, against all odds, one person winning two of the drum raffle prizes.

A huge thank you to all the volunteers who spend countless hours before, during and after the banquet to make it the success that it has always been.

YOUTH PROGRAM

The Outdoor Buddies Youth Program is intended to provide outdoor educational and recreational opportunities through a volunteer organization to youth and their parents.

GOALS

Outdoor Buddies is working to further expand outdoor opportunities to youth. The goals of this program include, but are not limited to:

- Increase public awareness and education about Colorado's natural resources and outdoor recreation opportunities.
- Build and strengthen family relationships through participation in outdoor recreational activities.
- Provide participating youth with the opportunity to develop strong positive ethical characteristics related to conduct in the field.
- Develop relationships with other organizations who work with youth to provide opportunities to engage youth in the wise use of our natural resources.



HIGHLIGHTS

- Activities are planned and developed to promote participation and education in the use of the outdoors for recreational activities.
- We endorse the principle that wildlife and the environment are to be protected, preserved and managed for the benefit of all people.
- Our program is taught through participation in outdoor activities.
- Parental participation is always welcomed and is required for certain activities.

STRUCTURE

- Activities are planned and tailored for each specific youth group. The types of youth groups served include Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, church groups, boys clubs, girls clubs, at-risk youth organizations and others.
- Our exclusive access to the campground located at Tarryall State Wildlife Area makes it available to youth groups. Available equipment includes tipis, tents, canoes, fishing and archery equipment and camping supplies. Qualified instructors and counselors can be provided.
- Activities for school-age youth and their parents are conducted primarily throughout the summer months with some activities conducted year-round.
- In addition to the Tarryall location, outdoor experiences are provided for youth and parents at various other sites throughout the state.
- Programs include sportsman education, safety and introduction to a variety of traditional outdoor activities, which include fly tying, game calling and tracking, spin and fly fishing, hunting, map reading and orienteering. Additional training can include GPS (Global Positioning System) usage, wildlife and land conservation, wildlife photography, firearm safety and shooting skills, archery, and outdoor survival.
- Programs offered use instructional guidance provided by professionals in the various fields being taught. When necessary, Outdoor Buddies will collaborate with other organizations such as the Colorado Parks and Wildlife, the Colorado Bow Hunters Association, Trout Unlimited, Ducks Unlimited and others to provide qualified instructors.



TARRYALL BUNKHOUSE and CAMPGROUND

Outdoor Buddies leases a cabin, a large garage and a 40 acre campground at Tarryall State Wildlife Area from the Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW). The leased cabin, which is called the bunkhouse is around 500 square feet. In the summer the bunkhouse has hot and cold running water, but during the winter months, the water is turned off and the water lines are drained to prevent damage to the plumbing due to freezing.

During the past several years, volunteers have donated hundreds of man hours of work in renovating the bunkhouse, so that it can be used year round. The entrance to the Bunkhouse is now wheelchair accessible. The kitchen is fully functional with refrigerator, countertop electric stove, electric coffee maker, microwave, and is equipped with cooking utensils. The bath has a tiled floor, wheel in shower, handicapped grab bars, toilet and sink.

In addition to a wood burning stove, there is a wall heater and Mr. Buddy propane heater so the bunkhouse can certainly be used during the winter months (just be sure to take a lot of water.) Outdoor Buddies hunters and fishermen can use the bunkhouse with prior arrangement. Ice fishing events can be held as soon as the ice on Tarryall Reservoir cooperates, and the bunkhouse provides shelter, warmth and the opportunity to have a warm meal after a day on the ice. There is a land telephone land line in the bunkhouse because cell phone service is not available in the area. Electrical hookups for trailers are also available and when the water is turned on, there is an outside water tap.



Along with its other equipment, Outdoor Buddies stores its 18 foot Lund outboard motor boat in the garage at Tarryall. The boat is used for group fishing events from June through August. Other equipment available includes a canoe, plastic sled, steel sled, ice auger, air compressor, propane stove, some ice fishing equipment and targets for archery. (The archery bows that we are now in possession of are in need of refurbishment or replacement.)

Activities on the 40 acre campground include camp outs for the disabled as well as youth groups. The campground is not available for use by the general public. Campers who make arrangements to use the campground are allowed to use Outdoor Buddies equipment, which includes tipis, tents and fishing accessories. The equipment is checked out for use by campers and Outdoor Buddies volunteers are available in case of emergencies or other assistance requested by campers. The campground is equipped with fire rings, picnic tables and an outhouse. There are also many hiking trails in the area.

Just some of the activities that have taken place at the bunkhouse and camp grounds are a Black Powder shoot in June of 2012, an Open House in October of 2012, and in 2014 a large Bible Study group enjoyed doing some rock climbing and had a terrific camping adventure.






FAMILY DAY at SWIFT PONDS

Thanks to the Sanfords, Larry and Penny and several enthusiastic volunteers, over 200 people enjoyed trap shooting, catch and release fishing, archery and a BB gun range. FAMILY DAY at WESTCLIFFE

Donna and Ralph Hood have hosted the annual family day event at their gorgeous Painted View Ranch in Westcliffe for the past 3 years .

On May 17th, 2014, approximately 300 people attended this event which honored wounded Veterans other Military Personnel and Veterans. The flag ceremony with a mounted color guard from Fort Carson and local American Legion Post 170 color guard was a truly patriotic start to the day. Reverend Andrew Zeller gave an inspiring prayer.

Special guests included members of the Warrior Transition Unit from Fort Carson, a contingent of patients and staff members from the Haven Behavioral War Heroes Hospital in Pueblo and many other military Veterans.

Local Parks and Wildlife representatives manned a laser shot video game and a local US Forest Service presented pack mule demonstrations. Paca Peach Ranch and some of their alpacas were in attendance as well Kent Weber, Executive Director of Mission Wolf Sanctuary, who conducted an educational program with wolves.

Special attractions for the kids included a bounce house, ducky races, stick horse races, face painting, animal balloons and cotton candy.

Outdoor Buddies volunteers under the direction of Ann Robey and Rob Adams provided a free lunch for the hungry folks. Lunch was followed by the mounted color guard from Ft. Carson showing off their riding skills with an equestrian demonstration.


