Firearms and Other Stuff

Thank you to all of you who came to this year's Family Day at Swift Ponds! We enjoyed each and every one of you and your families!

I want to thank the Outdoor Buddies Board of Directors for their dedication to the Outdoor Buddies Mission and their many hours they volunteer year after year!



Hello fellow outdoor Buddies! I Hope everyone is doing well this month...Not a lot going on this month...I finished the rear sight for Randy's H&R 929... I could not find any sight parts for this little .22 revolver. So, I made a new rear one from one of my old 45 ACP. It took a long time to get it to fit as I had to resize and re-thread the

mounting holes in the frame and replace both screws too. It looks good and I have lowered the front sight to match. I put a red ramp in the front, and white dots on the rear.

I got a 12 Ga. Semi-Auto, "Charles Daily" from Darrell last week that had a spent round stuck in it. It seems someone tried to remove this round with a hammer and a chunk of rebar! Please don't hammer on things! That is a BAD IDEA! It's real hard to find the real cause of the original problem if things are all beat on/up. So I got it all apart; the bolt lever, locking block, (for the bolt), firing pin, and extractor were all damaged and will need to be replace. The hammer and fire control checks out okay, the chamber is fine, and the receiver is okay too. So for about \$100.00 in parts, plus freight, we'll get it going again. Most likely the bolt locking block failed first, the other damage most likely came with the hammer and re-bar. This shotgun is made in Turkey in the same plant that does the C-Z Alloy receiver ones (712 Pump 912 Semi). It is a pretty good gun for the low cost. I am waiting to hear back from the owner. My C-Z 338-378 Whby. Mag. will be done soon, which is great even if I did not draw an antelope tag this year. The 416 Rigby is still in the works (Mercury recoil reducers) I'll finish it up once I get Frank & Bob theirs back. My next rifle build is going to be a C-Z 458 Lott. I have one in a Ruger #1 Tropical (Stainless Steel, Laminated stock) now. I'll sell it to build the C-Z. Why, you ask. Well, I think I want to be able to carry 3 rounds rather than just 1. Let's just call it bear insurance.

- Fishing Programs Committee** - Develop, implement, monitor, and evaluate all fishing activities.
- Fundraising Committee** - Develop and implement a fundraising plan that incorporates activities such as special events, raffles, donations solicitation, and grant seeking.
- Golf Tournament Committee** - Develop detailed plans and perform tasks required for a successful annual golf tournament.
- Hunting Programs Committee** - Develop, implement, monitor, and evaluate all hunting activities.
- Legal Committee** - Advise the Board on issues related to incorporation, bylaws, the IRS, liability insurance, lease and contract agreements, trademark registration, etc.
- Membership Committee** - Maintain the membership database. Develop and implement plans to satisfy accessibility of needed information to support programs and operations.
- Newsletter Committee** - Determine publishing dates and generate newsletter content.. Develop presentation of material and submit for approval. Publish approved newsletters.
- Planning Committee** - Create and monitor a tactical plan annually and present plan to the board for revisions and approval.
- Publicity Committee** - Develop news releases and announcements as appropriate. Organize periodic participation in radio and television media by our representatives.
- Sport Shows and Public Events Committee** - Monitor public events related to our mission. Recommend and implement actions for involvement when appropriate.
- Tarryall Operations Committee** - Schedule and manage activities at Tarryall SWA, including control and maintenance of leased properties and our equipment.
- Volunteer Coordination Committee** - Develop and maintain a definition of volunteers needed. Implement procedures for recruiting and matching available volunteers to needs.
- Website Committee** - Enhance the image of Outdoor Buddies by the general public and potential grantmakers through the development of a "best in class" website.
- Youth Program Committee** - The committee is responsible for developing, implementing, monitoring, and evaluating all youth program activities.
