Cow Elk Hunting Trip

Tim Wyman and I left Tulsa, OK at 8:00 AM on Thursday, December 4th, on our trip to Craig to hunt with Outdoor Buddies volunteers for cow elk.

I am a double amputee: Left BK and 1/2 of the right foot. And Tim's a Right AK.

An adventure!

It was a 14 hour trip covering about 900 miles, which we made driving straight through. We did have a slight detour that didn't slow us down too much as we had 'thought' we knew the right way, but then realized that without our GPS active, we made a mistake by going on I-35 toward Kansas City when we were supposed to take I-135 toward Salina.

We were able to take the detour along Kansas back country road 150 that ended up putting us on the right road. At the junction of the road we were on and the main highway we found gas at \$2.29 per gallon so we were very thankful for that. We found out later that gasoline was \$2.99 per gallon in Craig!

We got into Craig and rested the next day, getting familiar with the town, not finding any snow to speak of in the area and seeing some mule deer does just west of town.

Friday evening, Rob Sovine met us and took us to a restaurant where all the hunters and some of the helpers met for dinner. It was a fun evening.

Saturday morning at about 5:30 AM we met at the local Village Inn to have breakfast courtesy of Trapper Mining Company and then left for our hunt.

Once at Trapper Mine, we divided up into the Mining Company's F-250 4x4 crew cabs, and went out to find the elk.

That morning one hunter shot 5 times to get a cow while another hunter shot 8 times to get his cow elk.

I started out in a truck with Shawn Polly, Tim Wyman and Tony Gilroy and though we had some shots we never ended up with a cow.

It seemed that the elk were too far away and we just never hit what we were shooting at plus shooting from the truck was tough to do as a hunter has to be able to protect his gun/scope while the driver is negotiating the roads/terrain at various speeds besides trying to get into the right position to shoot.

So, it was an education for sure. Having sighted in our guns in Oklahoma much nearer to sea level, and having to shoot quickly with little time to get the sight picture plus shooting most often at running critters, it was tough for all of us.

While at lunch, we noticed an elderly man who got out of a car, fell into a rock garden beside the car at the Wendy's restaurant, and Tony (a firefighter) went out to help him. Soon there was an ambulance there to help the man as he'd gotten cut up.

After lunch, with two of the hunters tagged out, Tim and I were split up into different vehicles and as the trucks communicated about the elk location, trying to head them off to get a good shot, I was bouncing around pretty good in and out of the truck seat holding on to my gun, and trying to shoot some elk; cows that were truly high-tailing it across the prairie. I missed twice.

Tim eventually got a cow in the other truck, but he said he was aiming at the shoulder and hit about the hindquarter as it was about 80 yards away running crossing a road which they were on. I had a total of 4 shots that day but no hits.

I was shooting a 30-06 Remington 700 BDL with a muzzle brake and 168 gr Barnes VOR-Tex copper bullets.

Ron related that previously a 90 year old WW II Vet had shot his cow with a .243 though there was snow then that prevented the animals from doing a lot of moving, providing better shots. The animals this time were between 150-350 yards away and I'd sighted in at 200 yards. These elk were also moving and it was difficult to determine in a heartbeat how far exactly they were. We'd not practiced nor had any idea we'd be shooting at running animals, so I know I didn't lead mine as I shot for the shoulder as Tim did, and we probably missed due to not leading them besides the other factors.

We tried again on Sunday AM but it was soon evident that the elk had herded up again and were seen snug and secure on a mountain a half mile away with no easy access and it was decided that they were too spooked to hunt successfully so we called it quits.

We were shown around the mine workshop area and were able to have pictures taken standing next to the tires of some of the equipment. That was a real education as we were miniaturized by those machines!

I was the only hunter to not get a cow, but I had a great time, educational in many ways, and I made friends as well. I knew this was a 'hunt' and not a 'shoot' so there is NO guarantee that you will get one and it was evident that if there had been snow, we'd more likely have had a 100% success ratio.

Luckily we made it back home fine. Thank You, Lord, for a great adventure and a safe one!

Tim gave us some ground elk with beef suet and we fixed some 1" elk meat balls with spaghetti and served it to my wife's step-father and my Dad (both WW II Vets) and my mother and we all enjoyed the meal!

My wife enjoyed it so it looks like she'll encourage me to go after elk in the future!!

Tim Wyman's additions to the story:

After lunch on Saturday, Vince and I were split up in to separate trucks to better our odds. I'd had 10 shots already that day but it appeared my Red Dot scope/300 Win Mag weren't working correctly, so Tony was nice

enough to let me use his new gun with a nice Weaver scope.

After several failed attempts to intersect the heard or groups of elk there on the Trapper Mine and driving for miles back and forth on it, we finally got ahead of a small group before they crossed the road and I got my best chance to get one.

The elk were about 90 to 100 yards away on a full run right to left. I was amazed at how fast elk can run!

Waiting for my chance to shoot, the last cow presented me with my best shot so I aimed for her front shoulder and pulled the trigger.

It hit her in the left-rear leg! She fell down giving me time to reload and shoot again, hitting her in the lungs and she seemed down for good.

I asked if I should put another shot in her to make sure she stays down. Shawn said "No, she's down."

Just then she got up and ran over the hill!! I'm saying: NO WAY in disbelief!! Tony grabbed the rifle and off he went (he's also a fireman in a town nearby)!

In all the excitement I don't remember hearing if Tony took a shot or not – though later I found out he did finish her with a 9 mm handgun.

We drove to where the elk was laying and I was amazed at how big it was!

Tony wouldn't take a picture unless I held his gun to remember him by and prove how good his 308 really was! I was in Total Agreement!

On Sunday, I went with Shawn as Vince was with Ron to try to dog the elk toward where Vince might get a shot, reporting where we saw them. We just saw very few opportunities for shots, so it was agreed to stop the hunt.

P.S. I have a new Burris scope that is wonderful and the Red Dot has bit the dust!

We have a limited number of hunt slots for elk and deer as of now so the sooner you get your request in the better the chance you have of getting placed in one of those slots.

If you are disabled and want to hunt Pronghorn north of Wellington please send in your hunt request specifying which season you want to hunt. (Archery pronghorn or, October rifle or late season (November-December).

We need more helpers/guides for all the hunting programs, big game, upland bird, predator and waterfowl. Please let me know if you are interested so we can get you in the field and have some fun!
